- The American value system/Western






Skepticism & fears within the EU


- China has geopolitical ambitions and its goal is to undermine the global US leadership & the EU
- Would the EU's support of the BRI affect NATO?
- BRI projects are in conflict with EU legislation and pose challenges to European principles and values within the EU and in its neighborhood
- BRI: growing competition with China in the global & European markets
- The new institutions connected to the BRI have been developed without the active participation of the EU



The Interest of the EU in BRI (1.)

Economic

- Reconnects Asia with the EU: new market for European companies
- EU's global trade could increase (reduction in transport costs)
- Investment possibilities
- Has several overlaps with the EU's 'Juncker Plan': infrastructure bottlenecks e.g.







The Interest of the EU in BRI (2)

<u>Political</u>

- More independent foreign politics: less Atlantic, but more Eurasian orientation: Trumpeffect
- Rule-setter actor in the BRI
- Promotion of its norms in the
 - new institutions





Conclusion

- There is skepticism but interests too. The options:
 - Isolation & ignorance
 - Active participation
- Is there a real choice?
- Active participation would affect European identity...
- Post-Brexit EU
